Purpose:

To establish a procedure for dealing with requests to remove or relocate a fire hydrant by citizens of Corner Brook. Requests are usually received for the purposes of driveway installation or driveway widening.

Policy Statement:

The City will not relocate hydrants at the City's cost when requested to do so by residents of Corner Brook. The City may consider hydrant relocations at the residents cost when requested.

If requested to move a hydrant the City will determine that the hydrant is on city property. If the hydrant is located on City property, street right-of-way, etc.

- An estimated cost to cover the relocation will be compiled by the City to cover the required work.
- The resident requesting the work shall be advised of the anticipated cost and if he/she wishes to proceed, he/she must sign a work order to that effect with the understanding that he will be invoiced for the full cost at the completion of the work.
- 3. The City may at its discretion install a 45 degree bend to cut down costs, if it will provide enough lateral movement satisfactory to the "resident". The city will not consider a 90 degree bend as it will reduce flows.

If the hydrant is located on private property adjacent to a street right-of-way, the City will relocate the hydrant at City expense unless there is a legal easement in place, and then the above noted procedure would be followed.
