COMPOSTING AND FALL CLEAN UP

Fall leaf collection program is from November 18-22. Leaves must be put in clear bags and left at the curb on the day of your collection. Crews will pick up the bags of leaves for composting.

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WATER & WASTEWATER DIVISION SUMMARY

WASTEWATER SYSTEM:

The sanitary sewer flushing program is 80% complete, all 9 lift stations have been serviced and a cell upgrade has been performed at Riverside Drive sewage treatment plant.

WATER DISTRIBUTION SYSTEM:

All of the 837 fire hydrants have been serviced and 50% winterized. The water main flushing program is 95% complete and the service to the City's pumping stations and 20 pressure regulating stations is complete.

WATER & WASTEWATER SERVICE:

The City has responded to 626 water or wastewater requests, 88 water outages issued, 83-road closure and 23 precautionary boil water advisories.

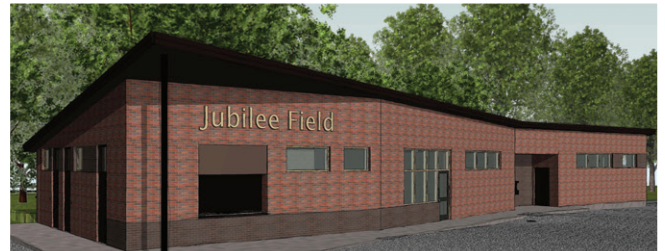
INFRASTRUCTURE CORNER UPDATE

Phases 1 and 2 of the Combined Sewer Separation Projects are complete. Phase 3 work is underway however, is near completion. The total cost of the Combined Sewer Separation Project is over \$10 million.

- East Valley Storm sewer project is complete **\$482,178**
- Main Street Bridge is complete **\$4,895,319**
- St. Mary's Brook culvert project is complete **\$165,122**
- Work has started on Gale / Cochrane waterline replacement, completion expected late October **\$544,061**
- Major Bertram Butler Trail has started in September **\$162,609**
- West Street/ Main Street traffic signal replacement project started September 23 **\$264,915**
- Georgetown Road water lateral replacement is in progress, completion expected late October **\$375,688**
- Bayview Heights waterline replacement complete **\$223,852**

JUBILEE FIELD UPDATE

Thanks to the support of the Federal and Provincial Government, the City of Corner Brook is able to proceed with the Jubilee Field Building reconstruction. A contract has been awarded to Brook Construction in the amount of \$1,779,855 (HST included). Work has begun with demolition of the former building and removal of trees. The new building is anticipated to be complete by June 1, 2020.
