BACKGROUND INFORMATION:

ENGINEERING

Capital Projects

Asphalt Program 2022 (Street Resurfacing)

- Tender is awarded to Marine Contractors for the value of \$3,111,831.00 HST Included
- Includes approximately 8400 tonnes of asphalt
- Pre-construction meeting took place June 9, 2022
- Tentative start date June 20, 2022
- Quality Control/Inspection Services awarded to All-Rock Consulting
- MYCW and Gas Tax funding

Mt Bernard Avenue Reconstruction

- Tender closing June 17th
- Work will include new underground infrastructure, curb/gutter, side walk(1 side) and asphalt
- Dillon Consulting is Consultant for the project
- ICIP funding, 80/20 funding ratio, qualified as regional project
- \$8 million budget

CB Recreation Centre

- Demolition is nearly complete
- Civil Work is well underway (water line, storm systems, roadways and parking lots)
- Structural foundation work has begun
- Architectural design is being finalized

DEVELOPMENT AND PLANNING

CB Acute Care Hospital (Healthcare Crescent)

Project Progressing on schedule for completion in fall 2023 to summer 2024

New Vet Clinic – (25 Poplar Road)

 Permits issued for Structural Steel and Civil Site works with review of Mechanical, Electrical and Architectural ongoing

New Subway Building - (Union Street)

Project is nearing completion and occupancy Permit is anticipated within the next month.

BMO Building - (1 West Street)

Major Interior renovation – Under review, permit to be issued.

Mini Home Subdivision: (O'Connell Drive – Dawe Pitch)

- Amendment has now completed its final Public Consultation and Commissioners Hearing
- Public Commissioner is currently compiling a report to summarize the comments from the hearing.
- Report will be forwarded to Council for consideration.

New IMSP and Development Regulations

- Consultant has submitted the Draft Municipal Plan and Development Regulations for Staff Review.
- Response will be provided back to the Consultant with feedback outlining changes that the City requires




Staratgic Tourism for Areas and Regions (STAR)

- Implementation Committee met last week and the next meeting is July 15th
- Funding application is finalized and submitted to ACOA and the Province
- Four areas of focus are:
 - 1. Branding for the region
 - 2. Tourism marketing strategy
 - 3. Wayfinding and signage
 - 4. Trail Development
- Draft branding Request for Proposals (RFP) is ready to go upon funding approval

City Hall Atrium Project

- Additional Come Home Year funding received from Province for project
- Staff worked with RAC and Grenfell to select winning proposal from submissions
- Artist Urve Manurels
- Artist will begin work in July





BUSINESS

Façade Appeal Comprehensive Enhancement (FACE) Program - Revised

- Program is intended to assist local businesses with improving the appearance of their business by providing a grant.
- The FACE program now offers **90**% of the first \$10,000 of eligible costs and **75**% of the investment over \$10,000, for a maximum total grant of \$10,000.
- Some interest in program but many are deferring investment plans due to current economic scenario

Downtown Urban Design Action Plan (DUDAP) - Phase I

- Last of the final small projects being completed
- Majestic Lawn Public Wi-Fi and camera infrastructure now installed
- Public Wi-Fi is now operational

DUDAP II

- Goal is to attract more people to the downtown
- Discussions with ACOA and the Province ongoing
- Planning is underway
- Looking for ideas for next phase of the project

Downtown Business Association (DBA)

- Staff are exploring a path to re-start the DBA
- · Preparing a brief for Council and Staff to review

SUSTAINABILITY

Community Gardens

- Lots of work has been accomplished to establish the **Curling (Barry Place)** community garden this season.
 - Beds and sheds are in place,
 - Topsoil and compost has been dropped off
 - o CB Stream has made lots of aesthetic improvements to the site
 - Gardening should commence soon
- Caribou Road was also a big priority for this year
 - o received a \$5000 EnviroFest grant to make some site improvements
 - o Improvements include new topsoil and sod, some fruit trees
- Reid Street is going strong

Local Food Infrastructure Fund

- In partnership with Western Environment Centre (WEC) submitting application for funding
- Hope is to establish a community greenhouse network in the City.
- o Partner with WEC to purchase of a new greenhouse
- Expanding partnership and programming to greenhouses currently in place at the Vine Place and Immaculate Heart School.

Trails

- Trans Canada (Great Trail) \$1.7 million project
 - o Engineering is well underway
 - Project to be tendered in June

- West Coast Cycling Association (WCCA)
 - The WCCA received \$100k from ACOA and provincial tourism to develop 2 bikepreferred (multiuse) climb trails in the Humber Valley within the City boundary.
 - o The City is providing \$20K towards the WCCA's cost share of the funding agreement,
 - o "The Hospital Trail" is also being developed by the WCCA for the City.
 - Gentle, multiuse trail going from Grenfell campus up to near the new hospital site.
 - Work will commence ASAP.

Tree Planting Program

- 12 new trees being trial planted in the City this summer
 - o 3 in town site, 3 on west, 3 on Broadway, and 3 will go in the Pratt Street area once we reach out to homeowners.

NOTE:

Council and the public can expect to see drones in the air this summer (June 23-26 tentatively) as staff work with members of the Canadian Forest Service to collect some multispectral data on canopy coverage and tree health throughout the city, ultimately developing a city wide geodatabase mapping the urban forest.
