The City of Corner Brook is presently accepting applications for the unionized position of **Power Engineer** within the Department of Recreation Services. This position reports directly to the Supervisor of Recreation Services, Facilities or their designate and is responsible for assisting with the day-to-day operations of the Corner Brook Regional Recreation Centre. The Power Engineer will focus on preventative maintenance, building equipment maintenance, pool maintenance, minor cleaning, and room set-up.

As the Power Engineer you will regularly assist the Supervisor of Recreation, Facilities with the completion of any regular, scheduled or emergency maintenance. This includes ensuring pool water chemistry is maintained and in accordance with applicable legislative standards. The Power Engineer will regularly perform preventative maintenance on pump systems, filtration systems, and chemical systems. In addition to utilizing your power engineering skills you must regularly provide onsite ad hoc janitorial and landscape duties, as required. Your energy and enthusiasm for Recreation will be important while assisting recreation staff with modifying facility configuration for events, providing customer support when needed, or assisting with programming from time to time. As the Power Engineer for the new facility, you will be a champion of safety, adhering to site-specific health and safety plans to mitigate or eliminate risks to you, clients, employees, and the public.

The successful applicant must possess, at minimum, a Power Engineering Class IV Certificate with a minimum of two years of working experience. To be successful in this position you must be proficient in the use of computers and computerized systems and possess excellent communication skills for liaising and communicating with customers, user groups and internal departmental staff. A current Royal Newfoundland Constabulary (RNC) Certificate of Conduct and Vulnerable Sector Check as well as a valid Class 5 driver's license for the province of Newfoundland and Labrador.

The successful candidate must possess or be willing to obtain, within the first 30 days of employment or as soon as reasonably directed by the employer, the Certified Pool Operator's (CPO) Certification.
